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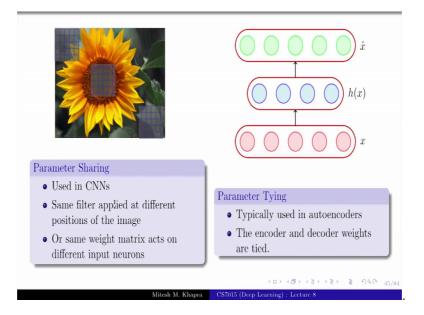

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So, parameter sharing and tying; I will just quickly go on this because for the sake of completeness it is there in this lecture, but it should, it would really make sense when I do convolutional neural networks. So, for the time being just take my word for it that in convolutional neural networks, you do a lot of parameter sharing where as the other place that you have seen parameter tying. So, that is again something that I am not going to talk about.

So, this is typically used in auto encoders, where the encoder and decoder weights are shared and that effectively reduces the number of parameters in the model which effectively reduces the complexity on the model.
